- With significant new revenue projected for the coming year and beyond, now is the time for Utah policy makers to fully fund Medicaid services, particularly health care that is an investment in preventing more serious and costly conditions.
- A prime example of these services is dental care for Medicaid enrolled adult Utahns.
- According to the Institute of Medicine, poor oral health often goes hand in hand with cardiovascular disease, diabetes, respiratory disease, and adverse pregnancy outcomes.
