What is Healthy Utah?

- Federal funds returned to state
- Puts most recipients into private insurance plans
- Individual contributions (premiums and co-pays)
- Work requirement
- Covers low-income adults (below 138% FPL)



The Healthy Utah Poll

 - Strong overall support 88%
 - Broad support
 - Bi-partisan support
 - Voters support specific plan features
 - Utahns want to help people in the "donut hole"
- Poll indicates Governor has found a "Utah Solution."




Poll Background


Healthy Utah Vs. The Alternatives









Of the following three options, which do you support the most?









89% of conservative Republicans prefer the Healthy Utah Plan over doing nothing.


Healthy Utah vs Do Nothing By Ideology (Republicans Only) Healthy Utah Plan

- Republicans strongly prefer Healthy Utah






Support for Specific Plan Features




 Utahns believe individuals should help pay the costs of their care





Attitudes about Health Insurance


 Utahns believe affordable health insurance is very important





Attitudes about Health Insurance


- Utahns believe people who are unable to afford health insurance should receive help from government

- Healthy Utah is a plan that meets those objectives—a "Utah Solution"
