This is a four-year initiative to increase enrollment and retention of eligible children in the state's public health insurance programs: Medicaid, Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) and the Utah Premium Partnership (UPP). Utah was one of 8 states to receive this grant.

2:50 Department of Health overview of legislative session (Michael Hales)

Toward the start of the General Session Utah Medicaid was facing an untenable situation: over 10% enrollment growth and a 14% budget reduction! Clearly, something had to give. Initially, we faced draconian cuts in eligibility itself, including coverage for pregnant women, eligibility for seniors and people with disabilities; a rollback of provider reimbursement rates to pre FY2007 levels, and deep reductions in hospital payments. These cuts were on top of an already substantial 3% reduction that occurred during a September 2008 special session which, among other things, resulted in the loss of critical outpatient services like physical therapy, occupational therapy, audiology, eyeglasses, and dental care. However, thanks to the federal economic recovery package, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA), the Legislature was given ample resources to reverse the course. Policymakers agreed to meet the "maintenance of effort" requirements to restore all Medicaid eligibility cuts; in exchange, the ARRA will provide Utah with over \$200 million. The Legislature decided to keep most of that money in the Medicaid program. Besides restorations to eligibility, the Legislature restored physician reimbursement rates, some of the cuts to non-physician providers and hospitals, and restored outpatient physical therapy and occupational therapy.
