<a href="#">H.B. 437</a>	Rep. Dunnigan	<p>Targets a small number of adults w/o dependent children, likely 0-10% FPL (single adult earning \$1,177/year or \$98/month). 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<a href="#">H.B. 275</a> <a href="#">H.J.R. 19</a>	Rep. Arent Rep. Chavez-Houck	This bill will be a joint resolution to put the issue of full traditional Medicaid expansion on the November 2016 ballot for the people of Utah to vote on. Even if the bill makes it out of the session and on to the ballot, if Utahns vote in support of expansion, it is only a recommendation to the legislature, not binding them to act on expansion (this would be different if it were a signature-gathered referendum). This will qualify for the enhanced federal match rate of 90/10.		0-133% FPL	Estimated 126,500 (FY17); 146,000 (FY21) (including woodwork ~22,000/year)
<a href="#">HB411</a>	Rep. Spendlove	This bill is a message bill to the federal government that Utah is willing to do a Medicaid expansion from 0-100% FPL if we could get the enhanced federal match rate at 90/10. This bill would also have provisions in it that would require beneficiaries to work, and the state would also attempt cap on either enrollment, costs, or both.	\$32M (FY17) \$32M (FY18) <a href="#">Fiscal Note</a>	0-100%	63,000 (FY17); 69,500 (FY21)

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
