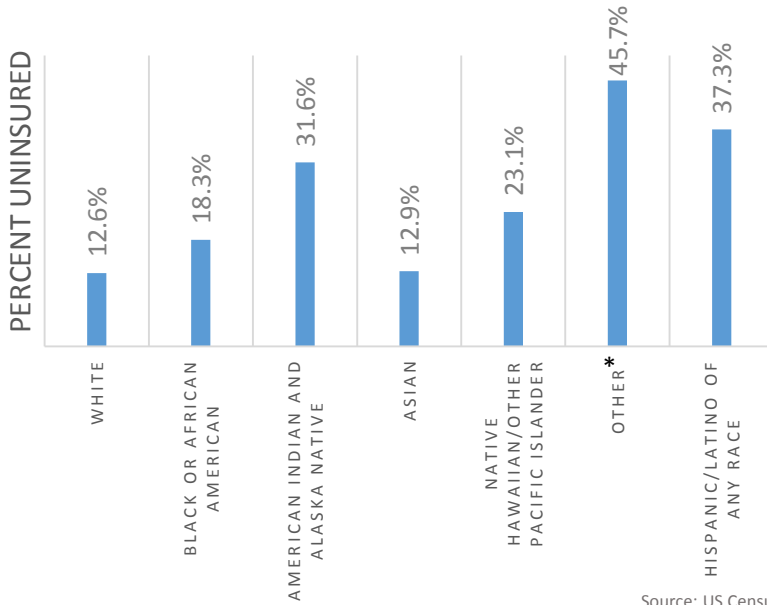


How Utah's Ethnic Constituents Are Impacted by Increased Access to Health Care Coverage

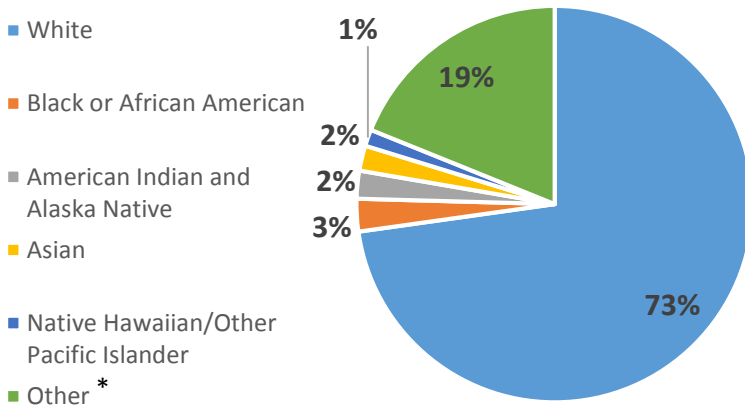
FACT: Utah's ethnic communities are disproportionately uninsured
